

## WHAT IS IT?

Online writing conferences are meetings setup with students about their writing via a video-telephony program such as zoom. The meeting is designed for the teacher and student to interact regarding the student's writing piece.

## IMPACT?

Writing conferences allow the teacher to provide specific feedback on the student's writing while allowing the student to reflect. Writing conferences provide a personalized approach to meet student's needs.
