Just-in-Time Support

Imagine a 3rd grade teacher has planned to teach their students to represent fractions on a number line. Because a subset of their students did not successfully master representing whole numbers on a number line, a skill they would have learned had they not missed that chunk of instruction in 2nd grade, a decision is in order.

Where's the right place to start? Rather than be derailed, the teacher employing Learning Acceleration determines that students who need it will be provided a number line with equally spaced points representing whole numbers. The teacher meets briefly before the lesson with the small group to introduce the scaffold and share how they'll use it in the upcoming lesson.

A gap is filled, students are not relegated to the back of the classroom during core instruction to catch up on a skill they missed, and the learning moves forward.

Learning Acceleration provides teachers with a high-leverage process to address gaps and ensure all students master essential grade-level standards. Learning Acceleration Specialists provide teachers with the extra hands and feet in their classrooms to respond flexibly to students' academic needs.

What does this mean for teachers?

- Integrating unfinished learning into new learning.
- Support to implement the tools, tactics, and mindsets that lead to Learning Acceleration.
- Strategies to spark student interest and curiosity in new learning.
- Proven methods to close vocabulary gaps.
- Help to prioritize access to grade-level content without delay.



The Learning Acceleration Partnership is focused on a two-part goal: Boldly improve learning conditions by: (1) accelerating learning for underserved students, and (2) supporting and stabilizing the educator workforce.

What to Expect

Beginning in the fall of 2024, a Learning Acceleration Specialist will be assigned to each of the participating LAP Schools.

Participation in Student-Center Coaching will support teachers to make the instructional decisions that increase access to grade-level content and maximize student mastery.

Teachers can also look forward to professional development on Learning Acceleration practices which include real-time formative assessment, feedback, and scaffolding to address learning gaps.







Learning Acceleration is...

Jump Start Lessons

1-2 lessons taught prior to the start of the unit that prepare students for grade-level content through mastery of essential prerequisite skills.

Concept Map

A standards-based learning progression that brings clarity to students and teachers by visually illustrating how separate learning targets build into an understanding of the big picture goal of the unit.

TIP Chart and Vocabulary Development Term, Information, Picture. A teacher and student

routine for vocabulary development and instruction.

Success Starters

A relevant introduction that serves to engage students and pique intellectual curiosity. Establishes relevance and supports students to feel they can be successful.

Student Work Sessions

The largest section of the lesson where students practice and apply new learning on their own and/or in cooperative groups. Teachers use the time to collect data on student progress and provide feedback.

Motivation

Includes interesting and relevant tasks plus positive, warm, & welcoming learner community.

Formative Assessment

Real-Time Assessments, Checks for Understanding, and Exit tickets that guide teachers to next steps.

Feedback

Specific and timely strength-based responses to student that guides their next steps in real time.

Scaffolds

Just-in-time supports to help students access grade-level content.
